Are you a counterfeit Christian?

Throughout my life, one thing I've found to be true is that most of the people I've shared the gospel with believe they're going to heaven. This is not because they have turned from their sin and placed their faith and trust in Jesus Christ. The reason is because of their works or good deeds. They take their works and place them on a scale and believe their good far outweighs their bad. They keep eight or nine of the ten commandments most of the time, so surely they must be going to heaven when they die. They are in church at least 3 out of every 4 weeks, give 10% of their money to the church and even bow their heads and pray before they eat. In fact, deep down, they believe a good, loving God would never allow someone like them to spend eternity in hell, right?

You might ask how do I know this to be true? The reason I know this is because I used to be one of these people who believed this way. I was at church every Sunday and Wednesday. I knew most of the popular Bible stories. I was even able to go knock on someone's door and explain the gospel as good as anyone my age. So, what does this mean? It means I had religion but not a relationship. I was a **counterfeit Christian**. I looked, talked and acted like a follower of Jesus Christ. People that knew me would have said, there goes a devoted follower of Jesus, but there was no relationship, and I was as lost as last year's Easter Egg. In fact, my own mother was shocked when

she found out that I had committed my life to Christ on a youth mission trip. I had fooled everyone, except myself and God.

The Bible says in **Ephesians 2:8-9** that we are actually saved, not by works but by grace through faith in Jesus Christ. We can't boast or brag about anything we've done because it has nothing to do with us. In fact, it's all about what Jesus Christ did for us on the cross! **Romans 3:23** tells us that we've all sinned and fallen short of God's glory. We've all blown it, and no matter how hard we try, we can never do enough to restore our broken relationship with Christ. **Romans 6:23** tells us that the wages or cost of our sin is literally death, but His gift to us is eternal life in Jesus Christ.

So, I have a couple of questions for you. **Are you a** counterfeit Christian like I was? Do you have religion instead of a relationship? Only you know if you have truly committed your life to Jesus Christ or you're just playing the game. I pray right now the Holy Spirit speaks to your heart and reveals the true nature of your heart. If you only have religion, then bow your head right where you are and Admit you're a sinner, Believe that Jesus is Lord and died on the cross for your sins, and lastly, **Commit** your to life to Jesus and ask Him to forgive your sins and save you. I promise you this will be the greatest decision you'll ever make!
