Pastor's Pen

may's flowers

They say, "April's showers bring May's flowers". If that is the case, I will be thankful to put this April behind me. It's not that I don't appreciate the

occasional rain, I do. It just that this season has been more a deluge than the occasional downpour; more clouds than sunshine. I am not speaking just meteorologically but spiritually as well.

This winter has been a difficult season for many in our church and our extended church family. It has been a season filled with loss, suffering that doesn't make sense, and questions that you can't find an answer for. If you've ever tried to feel your way through a dark house in the middle of a power outage, you can identify with how many are feeling right now.

Sunshine and the summer can't get here fast enough. Although winter is officially over and spring has sprung, many feel stuck in winter; mentally and physically exhausted, spiritually depleted, and emotionally alone. So let me ask you something. How are you doing right now? If you can't answer that right now, that's okay.

God is still God whether it is in the darkness or the light. Neither can keep Him from you and He's with you whether you can see or feel His presence or not. After all, He's promised to be with us always in whatever circumstances we face in life... sunshine or rain, daylight or dark. He's there. Sometimes, we just need to be reminded. I think that is one of the reasons that David wrote the 23 Psalm. Read it in the NLT.

The Lord is my shepherd; I have all that I need. ² He lets me rest in green meadows; he leads me beside peaceful streams. ³ He renews my strength. He guides me along right paths, bringing honor to his name.

Even when I walk through the darkest valley, I will not be afraid, for you are close beside me. Your rod and your staff protect and comfort me.

⁵ You prepare a feast for me in the presence of my enemies. You honor me by anointing my head with oil. My cup overflows with blessings.

⁶ Surely your goodness and unfailing love will pursue me all the days of my life, and I will live in the house of the Lord forever.

So, why did David write it? Was it just an affirmation of his faith or a song of worship? Or did David write because he knew that there would be days in the future that would be more rain than sunshine, more dark valleys than green meadows, more enemies than friends, and he would need to be remind himself that the Lord was still his Good Shepherd through all the ups and downs in life.

Just in case you needed a reminder. God is still God and He's Still Your Good Shepherd no matter what you are going through.

Life-Safety Upgrade



A critical life-safety upgrade to the fire alarm system was completed during the month of April.

The fire alarm system which serviced the Family Life Center was 22-years-old and obtaining replacement parts when needed had become an issue. This upgrade connects all three buildings to one fire alarm system, replaced/added smoke detectors in the Family Life Center, Preschool and The Lodge, as well as, added annunciators so that the audible alarm is broadcast to all three buildings.

The fire alarm system is monitored 24/7 by a monitoring company.
