- discover proven driving methods to help keep you and your loved ones safe on the road.

There are no tests and no driving. **Class size is limited** and the class is facilitated by a trained volunteer instructor. Two breaks are provided, one in the morning and one in the afternoon. Lunch is bring-your-own and will be limited to 30 minutes.

Please pray for these youth and their leaders as they travel and for life-changing encounters with Jesus!




Laundry Pods

Pastor's Notes



Staying Flexible

I am not sure if you've noticed that the older you get, the less flexible you become. When our activity begins to decrease either because of age or ability, our muscles, tendons, and all of the other things that help us move freely begin to tighten up. And, if we aren't careful, we begin to lose mobility and ability. That's why it's so important to stretch and remain flexible. If you don't believe me, just try to do something you used to do with ease when you were younger and your body is probably going to cry out in protest.

The same thing can happen spiritually, as well, if we aren't careful, but flexible probably isn't the word that we are looking for in this application. Pliable might be a better choice of words when it comes to our spiritual lives. Like clay that has become too dry for a potter to work with on the wheel, we have a tendency to become more resistant, rigid, and inflexible to change over time.

For example, just pick a topic of something a church might feel led to change like music, meeting times, programs, or the color of the carpet and see what happens... but what if God is up to a new thing? The inflexibility of many would cause them to miss the opportunity God was presenting. But what if it were possible to

seize new opportunities while preserving the best of what is at the same time? At least this is what Jesus said when he was challenged on it.

Matthew 9:17 (NIV) Neither do people pour new wine into old wineskins. If they do, the skins will burst; the wine will run out and the wineskins will be ruined. No, they pour new wine into new wineskins, and both are preserved."

New wine poured into new wineskins. Old wine preserved in old wineskins. One represents new opportunities to be a part of what God is getting ready to do. The other represents what God has already done and continues to do. The end result is that both are preserved and exist side by side.

This year we are going to see some changes take place at McConnell. New efforts will start and new initiatives will launch. At the same time, we will seek to hold onto the best of what doesn't need to change. I would ask that you would stay prayerful, pliable, and flexible as we seek to follow God's leading.
