Sheep Among Wolves

I am sending you out like sheep among wolves. Therefore be as shrewd as snakes and as innocent as doves. Matthew 10:16 (NIV)

I am not sure if you remember the movie but I am sure that you can remember the title... Dances with

(χ) dues. It was a western film starring Kevin Costner and is probably one of my favorite movies he's done simply because of the scenery and the story line. In the movie, Dunbar, Costner's character, earned the name "Dances with Wolves" among the Sioux Indians because he has befriended a wolf named Two Socks and was often seen with him.

Dances with Wolves is an appropriate name for Dunbar's character in the movie not because he has befriended a wolf but because he frequently found himself surrounded by wolves of another nature. People. At times, Costner finds it easier to dance with the real wolves than he does those who wear skin.

The same thing is true when it comes to the Christian life. Jesus sends us out into a world as sheep among wolves to share the Good News of Jesus Christ. There are those who are hostile to the Gospel and to Christianity and yet our mission is to reach them. How? By learning to be as "Shrewd as serpents and innocent as doves".

If we want to successfully translate the gospel to those who need to hear it in our community, we had better learn what Jesus meant and how to apply it lest we end up on next week's menu and see our efforts thwarted at every turn. Over the next several weeks, I want to invite you to be here for our new sermons series called **Shrewd** based on the command of Jesus in Matt. 10:16. In it, we will learn how to be obedient to the command of Jesus and to shrewdly leverage the gifts God has given us as a community of believers to reach our community.

Running with wolves can be dangerous and so is dancing with wolves if you don't know what you're doing. But if we can learn from the Master, we will not only learn how to dance but we will see the Kingdom grow. As God sends us out, let us learn to walk in step with His Spirit, depend upon in His strength, and follow Him faithfully.
