Worry: [wŭr'ē] to feel uneasy or concerned about something; to be troubled. synonym: **brood**

Unless you live under a rock and are totally cut off from the world, you know by now that our friends in Israel are at war. On October 7^{th,} they were brutally and shockingly attacked by the terrorist organization Hamas. In the early morning hours, Hamas blew holes in the border fence and invaded several Israeli towns near the strip. They targeted innocent civilians, slaughtering over a thousand men, women, and children. As they fled back into the Gaza Strip, Hamas took hostages with them, some of them were Americans.

Israel was left with no other choice but to respond with a show of strength and force that would not be misunderstood by their enemies. With nine million people in Israel, surrounded by hundreds of millions who are sworn to their destruction, Israel has no other choice. But what about us? When we see such things taking place, what should be our response as Christians?

Give into worry and fear? When we see what is going on in the world around us and in the Middle East, it is easy for us to wonder if the end is near. We hear of wars and rumors of wars, and it is easy to let our hearts be troubled by the possibility of being pulled into another global conflict. The site of the crucifixion is once again the most controversial and contested plots of land on the planet. And we worry. More than once, Jesus says "don't."

Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own. Matt. 6:34 (NIV)

Now what makes this next statement so amazing is that Jesus spoke it to his disciples on the night when one of them would betray him, the rest would abandon him, and they would watch him die on the cross.

Do not let your hearts be troubled. John 14:1 (NIV)

The best action we can take right now is not to give into worry or fear but to pray. To pray effectively, it helps to be informed about what is going on but not so much that we become consumed with it.

Pray for the peace of Jerusalem

(Psalm 122:6).

In addition to physical protection, the people of Israel desperately need to know the only true source of peace: the Prince of Peace.

Pray for wisdom for the Israelis as they respond and for protection from their enemies. (1 Peter 5:8)

Pray for the spiritual battle taking place. (Ephesians 6:18)

What Jesus said then, he says to us now. "Do not let your hearts be troubled." God is still on the throne, and He is in control regardless of what is happening right now or what may happen tomorrow.
