WARM UP: How well do you sleep at night: a) Like a log? B) toss and turn all night? C) wake at almost any sound?

Background: While the Kingdom message is being sown, it faces a variety of different receptions. Some may have thought that the inauguration of the Messiah's Kingdom would be accompanied by cataclysmic events. That did not seem to be happening with Jesus. In the

Jewish mind, the coming of the Messiah signaled the coming of God's promised Kingdom. Jesus stated that the Messiah had arrived with his Kingdom, but the fulfillment of the Messianic Kingdom would be delayed until he comes a second time. What, then, is the Kingdom of Heaven like? The parables in this chapter answer this question.
