**WARM UP:** If you've ever had a garage sale, how did you decide what to keep and what to get rid of? With the proceeds from the garage sale or moving sale, what worthy item would you purchase?

That's a keeper! This is the excited call of someone who has caught a fish

that is in season and is the right size to bring home to either be eaten or mounted on the wall as a trophy. If you know anything about fishing at all, few of the fish you catch are going to be keepers. Most are neither a keeper or a trophy or even the right kind of fish that is in season and have to be thrown back.

Like the parable of the wheat and the weeds, the parable of the dragnet deals with the separation of the righteous and the evil and judgment. But unlike the parable of the wheat and the weeds, this focus of this parable is on the final judgment and the punishment that will follow it.
